
#### New Baton Rouge Irish Film Festival Event: Wee Irish Film Night

The 2013 Film Festival has added another day and another great event to the festivities at the Manship Theatre. **Wee Irish Film Night**, held on Friday night, July 19, will show seven short films: The End of the Counter, Barry's Bespoke Bakery, Fear of Flying, Irish Folk Furniture, El Toro, Sylvia and a non-judged TV short, Mrs. Brown's Boys.

Audience members will be asked to vote on their favorite short film. At the conclusion of the evening the O'Kalem Award – the Audience Choice for Best Short Film – will be unveiled. The award was created locally by Nick Oldenburg (glass) and Mitch Evans (wood) and features handblown green glass mounted on an engraved walnut base.



#### SYNOPSES OF FEATURE FILMS

**The Secret of Roan Inish** is centered on the Irish and Orcadian folklores of selkies – seals that can shed their skins to become human. The story is about Fiona, a young girl who is sent to live with her grandparents and her cousin Eamon near the island of Roan Inish, where selkies are rumored to reside. It is an old family legend that her younger brother was swept away in his infancy and raised by a selkie. Fantasy/Drama, **rated G** 

Blazing the Trail: The O'Kalems in Ireland is a feature-length documentary on the New York based Kalem Film Company which made history in the early 1900s by sending leading film-makers, director Sidney Olcott and screenwriter and lead actress Gene Gauntier, to County Kerry in Ireland. They produced a series of ground-breaking films celebrated for their authentic settings and unrivaled in their use of scenery. The film tells the story of Olcott and Gauntier's adventures in Ireland. **Earthbound** is about a man who finds out from his dying father that he is an alien and must continue his dying species. Joe was just a man who wanted an ordinary life, a place to call home and a nice girl to settled down with. To fulfill his father's wishes he finds a compatible human mate, Maria, and falls in love with her. While trying to convince her that he is an alien he learns that intergalactic bounty hunters, disguised as human resource specialists visiting his office, are in hot pursuit of him. Maria joins Joe in his attempt to escape to his home planet. Science Fiction/Comedy, **rated PG13** 

**The Guard** tells the story of Sergeant Gerry Boyle (Brendan Gleeson) of Galway who is crass and abrasive and interprets the law a bit freely, all too glorious comic effect. Paired with strait-laced American FBI agent Wendell Everett (Don Cheadle), Boyle seeks to solve a couple of murders and disrupt a massive drug shipment in what could have been a buddy comedy – but, through a combination of sharp and witty writing, ruthless speedy editing and understated but spot-on performances, the movie is a marvel of character-based storytelling. What is a Céilí? (pronounced kay-lee) Céilí dances (fior céilí) are a popular form of folk dancing in Ireland and are performed at get-togethers such as house parties and corner road gatherings in the rural countryside for fun, fellowship, and laughs (or craic as the Irish might say). Céilí dances are based on heys ("hedges" – pairs of lines facing), round dances, long dances and quadrilles.

A Céilí dance may be performed with as few as two people and as many as sixteen. Céilí dances may also be danced with an unlimited number of couples in a long line or proceeding around in a circle. Céilí dances are often fast and complex and are typically danced to Irish instruments such as the Irish hand drum or harp.
